

ON-LICENCE

Sections 14 and 64

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act (the Act), **BRAUGARTEN LIMITED** (the licensee) is authorised to sell and supply alcohol, on the premises situated at **100 Oxford Terrace, Christchurch**, and known as "**KAISER BREW GARDEN**", to any person for consumption on the premises, and to let people consume alcohol there.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

CONDITIONS

- a) No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1 pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.
- b) Alcohol may only be sold or supplied on the following days and during the following hours:
MONDAY TO SUNDAY 8.00 AM TO 3.00 AM THE FOLLOWING DAY
- c) Water must be freely available to customers on the premises while the premises are open for business.
- d) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
 - i) Display of appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
- e) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the management of the premises concerned are observed:
 - i) Alcohol must only be sold, supplied and consumed within the area marked on the plan submitted with the application.
- f) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
 - i) The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in their host responsibility policy aimed at promoting the reasonable consumption of alcohol.
- g) The whole of the premises is designated as a **supervised area** for the first floor bar, but the mezzanine floor will remain undesignated until 9.00 pm when the whole premises become supervised.

OTHER RESTRICTIONS AND REQUIREMENTS TO BE NOTED ON THE LICENCE

Section 50 - One-way door restrictions in local alcohol policies to be complied with; Section 51 - Non-alcoholic drinks to be available; Section 52 - Low alcoholic drinks to be available; Section 53 - Food to be available; Section 54 - Help with information about transport to be available; Section 56 - Display of signs; Section 57 - Display of licences; Section 214 - Manager to be on duty at all times and responsible for compliance.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force—

- a) either—
 - i) until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
 - ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but
- b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either—
 - i) until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or
 - ii) if it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.

THE LICENCED PREMISES

The premises are identified on the plan provided with the application for a licence.
